Tribute to Jungle Victims

QUITO, Ecuador, Jan 14 (AP).

Five widows flew over the jungles in northeastern Ecuador today for a final homage to their American missionary husbands, who were massacred last Sunday by savage Auca Indians.

The widows dropped wreaths from a United States Air Force plane to the spot below where their husbands have been buried. At the request of the widows, the missionaries had been buried at the places where their bodies were found.

Four of the bodies were discovered by a helicopter party Thursday night. The fifth was found yesterday. All had been mutilated.

The five men were T. Edward McCulley [sic] of Wauwatosa, Wis.; Roger Youderian, of Lansing, Mich.; Nathaniel Saint, of Huntington Valley, Pa.; James Elliot, of Portland, Ore., and Peter Fleming, of Seattle, Wash.
